





BRHP on Elevate Maryland Podcast!


On July 22, Candace Dodson-Reed and Tom Coale of <u>Elevate Maryland</u>

Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Mobility Demonstration

The Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Mobility Demonstration was authorized and funded through the 2019 and 2020 Appropriations Acts. A total of \$50 million is available to public housing agencies that participate in the demonstration: up to \$10 million is for new vouchers for families with children and the remainder is available for mobility-related services, such as rental housing counseling, security deposit assistance, and landlord outreach. The 2019 Appropriations Act also makes available \$3 million for a research evaluation.



BRHP is pleased to see the release of HUD's competitive funding notice, which provides an exciting opportunity for collaboration among our region's public housing agencies to seek much needed funding for rental housing counseling services to empower hundreds of more families with children to expand their housing choices and access areas that are safe, healthy and economically vibrant.

Have You Completed Your Census? Make Sure Your Household is Counted Before Sept. 30 Deadline!



The census is **quick and easy**. It only takes about **10 minutes to complete**. It's also **safe, secure, and confidential**. Your information and privacy are protected.

Why is the 2020 Census important?

Your response helps to direct billions of dollars in federal funds to local communities for schools, roads, and other public services. Results from the 2020 Census will be used to determine the number of seats each state has in Congress and your political representation at all levels of government. According to self-response rates across the country, Maryland is currently tied at number 10 with 67.6

percent. **Take the census here** before

the new September 30 deadline.
