Moving With BRHP

Moving can be a complicated process, and it's easy to for certain things to fall through the gaps. Please use this checklist to ensure a smooth transition to your new home.

Preparing to Move
Before you move, certain BRHP forms must be completed.
Finding Your New Home
Opportunity Area? BRHP's search tool at brhp.org/search-tool can help you determine whether a property is in an Opportunity Area or not. Opportunity Areas have significant benefits such as strong jobs and schools, and are eligible for BRHP Security Deposit assistance loans.
Affordability Check
Once you've found a property, it needs to be checked for affordability. Checks can be requested at housing-search@brhp.org or via our website.
Forms to Submit
Request for Tenancy Approval (RTA) Packet The RTA packet is a series of forms covering topics like safety, rent, and landlord information, and should be completed together with your landlord. It can be found at brhp.org/residents under the Resources and Forms tab, and should be submitted to rta@brhp.org.
Lease Email a signed copy of your lease to leases@brhp.org.
Interim Change Forms (if applicable) Any changes in household income, number of people on your voucher, and accommodations should be reported via a BRHP Interim Change form, accessible via BRHP's website at brhp.org/residents/resources-forms.
Things to Prepare
Security Deposit BRHP offers security deposit assistance via a special loan program, available for properties in Opportunity Areas. You can apply for this loan with your BRHP counselor or at housing-search@brhp.org. Remember that you will still be responsible for a portion of your deposit!
